Covid-19 Appeal for Malawi – Update.

We intend closing the Malawi Covid-19 Appeal on 17th March 2021

Dear Friends of Malawi,

In the UK: We are moving into spring, with the days getting longer and brighter and our outlook also begins to look brighter. The new cases & deaths continue to fall, along with numbers of people in hospital with Covid-19, and with the "role out" of the vaccine our future begins to look brighter, let's hope and pray that continues.

In Malawi: I am pleased to report that things in Malawi are also beginning to improve. Over the past three weeks, Malawi has also been seeing their numbers of new cases and the numbers of deaths from the coronavirus continuing to fall. Let us all continue to pray for our friends in Malawi.

On Monday 1st March, we received an urgent request for help from Fr. Denis, asking for financial assistance to purchase items to help protect his poor parishioners from the virus, they have so little money to buy such things as soap, sanitizer, disinfectant, face masks and buckets to set up washing stations at their churches and out stations.

On Wednesday $3^{\rm rd}$ March, your Malawi Team, transferred £3,000 to each of our three linked parishes. This £9,000 was taken from our funds, for our "on-going projects" for example, sponsorship fund and our Malawi container project.

I am grateful for all those who have kindly donated to our Malawi Emergency Covid Appeal, the appeal so far has raised a wonderful some of £6,314-10 this was great at such short notice and of course our appeal has not reached all of our parishioners, as many are not reach by the parish "fan out" system for receiving newsletters and are not attending church at present. Any further donations would be most welcomed.
