- 2) Some parishioners find it difficult to bring their donations to church. In the past Colin O'Hara and I have operated a collection service; I am looking for volunteers to assist Colin.
- 3) We are looking for parishioners to help sort and pack the donated items in our warehouse. We pack on Saturday afternoons; these are always fun afternoons, with tea / coffee and cake. If you can spare the odd Saturday, please consider joining us.

- *KFC Tunbridge Wells.* Who will supply us with the cartons needed for packing
- *Kevin Wilkins* our IT engineer will again be busy refurbishing computers. *How can you Help !!*

We have a small overspill from last year, which is packed ready for dispatch.

- Many children still run around in clothes no better than rags. So Lots of children's clothes please, from babies through to teenagers.
- Adults need shoes, bedding, household tools, reading glasses and sewing machines.
- Tools are required to help cultivate garden plots and carry out repairs to their homes.
